1 First Section

1.1 A Subsection Sample

Please note that the first paragraph of a section or subsection is not indented. The first paragraphs that follows a table, figure, equation etc. does not have an indent, either.

Subsequent paragraphs, however, are indented.

Tables

Tables should be centred and numbered sequentially throughout the text and referred in the text by number (table 1, not tab. 1). Captions should be placed at the top of the table and should have a full stop (period) at the end. The caption should be the same width as the table. Tables should have only horizontal rules and no vertical ones. Generally, only three rules should be used: one at the top of the table, one at the bottom, and one to separate the entries from the column headings.

Example

Table 1. Table captions should be placed above the tables.

Distance (m)	Velocity (ms ⁻¹)

150	34.64
200	23.76
250	27.9

Displayed equations are centered and set on a separate line.

$$x + y = z$$

Figures

Each figure should be centered and should have a brief caption describing it. Captions should be centered, below the figure and separated from it by a distance of 6 points. Figures should be numbered sequentially through the text—‘Figure 1’, ‘Figure 2’ and so forth.

Fig. 1. A figure caption is always placed below the illustration. Short captions are centered, while long ones are justified. The macro button chooses the correct format automatically.

Acknowledgements

Authors wishing to acknowledge assistance or encouragement from colleagues, special work by technical staff or financial support from organizations should do so in an unnumbered acknowledgements section.

The Harvard referencing style should be followed. For citations of references, we prefer the use of square brackets and consecutive numbers. Citations using labels or the author/year convention are also acceptable. The following bibliography provides a sample reference list [1] Book, [2] Journal Article, [3] Website, [4] Newspaper or Magazine.

3. Author/Poster Surname, Initial(s). [@Handle] (Publication year) Content of Post [Social Media Site] Day Month Published. Available at: URL (Accessed: Day Month Year).
4. Author Surname, Initials. (Publication Year) 'Article title', Newspaper/Magazine Name, Day Month Published, Page(s). Available at: URL or DOI (Accessed: date).

The general layout rules are:

- The paper should include the author's name(s) and affiliation(s) (full address including country).
- **All the submissions must be in English and adhere to a maximum word limit of 5000 (excluding author's name and keywords).**
- The paper should be submitted as a Word file, formatted in Times New Roman, 12pt, single-spaced, and follow the Harvard referencing style.
